Official Information Act Request

Thank you for your request of 23 May 2022, under the Official Information Act 1982, for the following information:

1. *Has NZQA got any data on the number of students and/or grades that have been changed to NA for school internals as a result of plagiarism. Is there sufficient data over several years to detect a trend? Or if NZQA does not have this data I assume OIAs could be sent to schools direct?*

Response:

Question 1:

NZQA does not carry this information and we are not aware of any other organisation that holds this data. The request is therefore declined under Section 18(g) of the Official Information Act 1982.

Question 2:

In 2017, NZQA and the Ministry of Education conducted a survey with all schools across New Zealand regarding plagiarism and the potential for Ministry-led syndicated procurement of anti-plagiarism software. We decided not to proceed with the initiative due to lack of demand from schools.

Since this survey, NoPlag, a provider of anti-plagiarism software, has provided free access to all schools. However, schools are free to use an alternative provider (e.g. Grammarly or Turnitin).

NZQA does not hold data about how many schools are using NoPlag or other anti-plagiarism software providers.

As part of the commitment to open and transparent government, NZQA is proactively releasing responses to Official Information Act requests which are of public interest. NZQA intends to publish its response to this request on its website as part of its next quarterly release of documents. Your name and contact details will be removed before publication.
