- it is recommended that you complete standard 29711, Demonstrate knowledge of weaving resources and tikanga of te Whare Pora, before you complete this standard.

Achievement Criteria

For Paetae/Achieved

Demonstrate skills to harvest and prepare harakeke and raranga konae will be evidenced through:

- tools and materials are identified for harvesting and preparation;
- harakeke is harvested and prepared;
- two konae are woven using takitahi pattern.
- tapiki and base are secured

For Kaiaka/Merit

Demonstrate proficient skills to raranga konae will be evidenced through:

- corners are even and balanced;
- tapiki is tidy and the raranga tension is consistent.

For Kairangi/Excellence

Demonstrate artistic skills to raranga konae will be evidenced through:

- konae has no gaps and is of an exceptional standard;
- tapiki is balanced.

Assessment Task 1

Harvest and prepare harakeke for konae

All work produced by you must be written in your own words. Ensure to reference all your sources of information. Ngā mihi.

1. OBTAIN PERMISSION TO HARVEST YOUR HARAKEKE FROM A SPECIFIC SITE.

Who owns the land and who gave you permission to harvest the harakeke?

2. IDENTIFY ALL THE TOOLS AND MATERIALS FOR HARVESTING AND PREPARING YOUR HARAKEKE FOR KONAE.

3. WHAT IS THE TIKANGA OF TE WHARE PORA, FOR HARVESTING HARAKEKE FOR KONAE?

4. HARVEST HARAKEKE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TIKANGA OF TE WHARE PORA.

Note: you must harvest enough harakeke to enable you to complete two konae.

5. PREPARE YOUR HARAKEKE FOR KONAE.

Show evidence of the following:

- quality of the harakeke is graded, free from disease, not broken, infected or discoloured
- that the quantity of whenu prepared is enough to complete two kono
- size of your whenu width and length are consistent
