

Qualification Title: New Zealand Certificate in Trade Baking (Craft) (Level 4) with strands in Bread, Cake and Biscuit, and Pastry

Final decision on consistency of the qualification: National consistency is confirmed

Threshold

The threshold to determine sufficiency with the graduate profile was determined as evidence of graduates providing the baking industry with trade qualified craft bakers who can independently produce a wide range of bakery products to commercial standards.

Introduction

The purpose of this Level 4 and 185 - 195 credits qualification is designed for people working in a range of commercial craft baking environments with responsibility for meeting production and quality requirements. The qualification includes three strands to allow graduates to specialise in producing a full range of either bread, cake and biscuit or pastry baking products. Most graduates undertook the bread strand. The qualification provides the baking industry with trade qualified craft bakers who can independently produce a wide range of bakery products to commercial standards.

The qualification developer, Hanga-Aro-Rau Workforce Development Council, participated in this review alongside an education organisation with two representatives from NZ Bakels who deliver this programme, but do not award the qualification. One education organisation with graduates participated in the online consistency review meeting with a total of 92 graduates across the four-year reporting period for this consistency review.

The baking qualifications are under review with the wider baking sector participating in building a new unified qualification structure.

Final Consistency Review Report

Evidence

The education organisation provided a range of evidence to demonstrate that their graduates met the graduate profile outcomes (GPOs).

The criteria used to judge the evaluation question were:

- The nature, quality and integrity of the evidence presented by the education organisation
- How well the organisation has analysed, interpreted and validated the evidence, and used the understanding gained to achieve actual or improved consistency
- The extent to which the education organisation can reasonably justify and validate claims and statements relating to the consistency of graduate outcomes, including in relation to other providers of programmes leading to the qualification.

How well does the self-assessment and supporting evidence provided by the education organisation demonstrate that its graduates match the graduate outcomes at the appropriate threshold?

Evidence provided for this review included:

- Confirmation that the education organisation had a programme of study which ensured that programme components led to the graduate profile
- Evidence of moderation of assessor judgements and assessments, that assured the programmes were assessed at an appropriate level
- Records of feedback from graduates and employers
- Destination data indicated continuation within industry and progression to further study.

Overall, the self-assessment and supporting evidence supplied, demonstrate that graduates meet the graduate outcomes at the determined threshold.
