<b>Strategic purpose statement</b>	<p>This is a foundation qualification intended for people wanting to gain skills and knowledge for the purpose of further study, and/or roles in marae-based kāuta/wharekai services and/or the hospitality industry. This qualification will provide marae, communities, and the hospitality industry with people who have entry-level kitchen skills, developed in a kaupapa Māori context.</p> <p>Graduates of this qualification will have skills in and knowledge of, basic food preparation and cooking, as well as working in accordance with tikanga and marae kawa, under supervision.</p>

	<b>Education pathway</b>	<p><a href="#">This qualification may pathway on from Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki, Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 1) [Ref: 3043].</a></p> <p>This qualification may lead to the New Zealand Certificate in Manaaki Marae – Te Nihowera, Te Ringawera (Kaupae 3) [Ref: 2434] and/or the New Zealand Certificate in Cookery (Level 3) [Ref: 2100].</p> <p>This qualification may also provide a pathway of further study in Hospitality (Accommodation, Cookery, and Food and Beverage), as well as in areas of Māori Studies, Tourism (especially Tourism Māori) and Event Management.</p>

	<b>Employment/ Cultural/ Community pathway</b>	<p>Graduates will have the skills and knowledge to work in entry-level positions in a professional kitchen and in food service. Graduates may work in a variety of these positions, such as: kitchenhand, café worker, wait staff, food and beverage factory worker, as well as ringawera.</p> <p>Graduates of this qualification will also have the skills and knowledge to support whānau, hapū, iwi, and hapori to contribute to the operational running of wharekai and/or kāuta, under supervision.</p>
<b>Guiding Kaupapa</b>		<p><b><i>Te reo me ngā tikanga</i></b></p> <p>This kaupapa affirms the mātauranga held by the people of the marae. This includes expertise in <del>local marae</del>-kawa and tikanga <del>ā-iwi</del>; use of te reo Māori, including mita <del>ā-iwi</del> and <del>local</del>-kōrero <del>ā-iwi</del>; demonstration/role-modelling of positive behaviours based on tikanga-<del>Māori</del>; meeting legal and ethical requirements in a professional manner; and the rangatiratanga of iwi, hapū and marae.</p>
		<p><b><i>Whanaungatanga</i></b></p> <p>This kaupapa highlights the importance <del>toof</del> Māori <del>of cultural values in establishing, building and maintaining</del> quality relationships, <del>developed through shared experiences and working together (which provides people with a sense of belonging)</del>. It embraces those skills and strategies that relate to communications and relationships, such as being able to <del>understand different types of relationships and stakeholders; knowing how to</del> establish, maintain and enhance relationships, <del>both internally and externally</del>; behaving in a manner that upholds the mana of others, as well as one's own; and understanding the significance of peoples' <del>s</del> <u>varying needs</u>, roles and responsibilities, and the contribution that each person makes.</p>
		<p><b><i>Pūkengatanga</i></b></p> <p>This kaupapa emphasises the importance of having <del>the</del> knowledge, skills and experience to deliver <u>a quality services</u>. It has also been applied broadly to incorporate the new knowledge and skills required to effectively utilise modern technology and tools to protect, manage, and enhance the mātauranga Māori systems of ngā tūpuna. It also encompasses important aspects of legal and regulatory obligations and compliance.</p>
		<p><b><i>Manaakitanga</i></b></p> <p>This kaupapa acknowledges the responsibility for <u>caring and looking out for others</u>. This includes hosting manuhiri, <del>the onus of</del> the guardianship of <del>those all people</del> in one's care, and the implications of doing this well (or otherwise), especially in the context of providing kai. It demands excellence of the hosts so as to uphold the <del>ir</del> mana, <del>as well as</del> mana of all guests <u>and, in doing so, their own and the marae itself</u>.</p>
